Child speak definition:

Learning to live alongside others.

Objectives:-

Enable children to acquire a broad general knowledge of, a respect for, public institutions and services in England.

Enable children to acquire an appreciation of, and respect for, their own and other cultures.

Encourage respect for other people.

Focus:-

Understand that the freedom to choose and hold other beliefs and faiths is protected in law.

Accept that differences are OK.

Accept that other people have different faiths or beliefs and that these should not be the cause of discriminatory behaviour; neither should it be based on ethnicity, disability, gender, sexuality, differences of family situations or age.

Understand the importance of identifying and combatting discrimination.

Promoted through:-

- Celebrate cultural festivals.
- Humanities curriculum (e.g. conscientious objectors).
- Community links (e.g. Margery Girling residential home).
- Visitors (e.g. Paralympian).
- Community week.
- RE lessons and teaching of key concepts.
- Displays.
- Cultural assemblies.
- Challenging prejudicial or discriminatory behaviour (e.g. discussions on offensive language).
